

Lavender Sachet



These sweet little lavender sachets are perfect for showcasing your sewing machines preprogrammed embroidery stitches and make great gifts or 'bazaar' makes for your fundraising events.

They use up scraps of fabric from your stash too!

Materials Required:

- 2 pieces 15cm x 10cm of plain calico fabric or something similar
- Tear Away Stabiliser
- Coloured thread
- Hollowfibre Stuffing
- Lavender
- Label of your choice (optional)

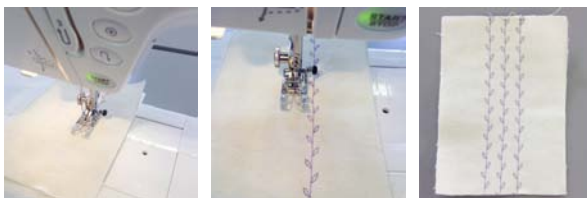
Making up:



1. Take 2 rectangles of fabric approximately 15cm x 10cm and place a piece of stabiliser underneath your fabric.

Stabiliser is a useful support for your fabric when you are going to use a lot of stitches in your item. Simply tear away what you don't need when your stitching is finished.

2. Sew 3 lines of pre-programmed embroidery stitches, lengthwise on your piece of fabric.



3. Gently tear away any unused stabiliser.

4. Sew your label, centrally, on to the other piece of your fabric. Turn in any raw ends. At the corners, do a 'pivot turn'. Leave your needle in your work. Lift the presser foot lever, turn your work, lower your presser foot lever and continue sewing.



Repeat on all four corner until the label is stitched in place.



5. Lay your front and back pieces together with the wrong sides together.

6. Sew, using a straight stitch, 1.5cm from the edge of your fabric all around the edges.

but leave a 3 to 4cm gap (this is where the lavender and stuffing is going to be put in).

7. Stuff with hollowfibre and some lavender.



8. Complete your line of straight stitches to close the gap.



9. Change to zig zag stitch on your machine (Stitch width 2 and Stitch length 0.5) and using your coloured thread, sew using this stitch over the top of the straight stitching you have already done to create a frame.

10. Finally, using pinking shears, cut around the edge of your sachet. ***Et Voila! You have a pretty lavender sachet for your sock drawer.***
